

POLARIS® HILLCLIMBERS DOMINATE CHAMPIONSHIPS AT JACKSON HOLE AS 5 RACERS WIN TOTAL OF 10 PRO CLASSES; KEITH CURTIS SWEEPS KING CROWNS AGAIN

MINNEAPOLIS (March 28, 2019) – Five Polaris® hillclimbers won a total of 10 Pro-class titles and Keith Curtis swept all four King of the Hill crowns as Polaris snowmobile racers dominated the 2019 World Championship Snowmobile Hillclimb held March 21-24 in Jackson Hole, WY.

Polaris racers won all four Pro Stock classes and six of eight Improved Stock and Modified classes. Curtis continued his record-setting 2019 campaign by winning four of five Pro classes he entered, winning all three King of the Hill crowns – Stock, Improved Stock, and Modified – and winning Jackson’s King of Kings title. He has swept all three King crowns at each of the first three events on the 2019 Rocky Mountain States Hillclimb Assn. (RMSHA) schedule.

Polaris racer Shelley Balls won the Women’s Stock class and the Queen of the Hill crown, and Dolan Phelps won the Pro Masters Modified class.

Polaris Pro Class Domination

Three Polaris hillclimbers won at least two Pro classes, and two other racers won a single class:

- Les Keller won 600 Stock and 700 Stock and took second in 600 Improved.
- Keith Curtis won 900 Stock, 1000 Stock, 900 Improved, and Open Mod, and he finished second in 900 Mod. All of his podium finishes were achieved on sleds with the new Polaris® 850 Patriot™ engine.
- Sam Peterson won the 600 Improved and 700 Improved classes, and he took second in 600 Stock.
- Andy Thomas won 600 Modified and was second in 700 Improved.
- Justin Thomas won 900 Modified and was third in both 900 Improved and Open Mod.

Luke Rainey earned three podium finishes with seconds in 900 and 1000 Improved, and a third in 900 Stock, and Kyle Heap reached the podium twice with thirds in 700 Stock and 600 Improved. Brandon Titensor took third in 700 Improved.

In three RMSHA events this season, Polaris racers have won 30 of 36 total Pro classes and 11 of 12 Pro Stock classes.

Queen of the Hill

Shelley Balls reached the podium twice in Women’s classes, winning the Stock class and taking second in Improved before going on to win the Queen of the Hill title. Tayler Meyers took third in Women’s Modified. Polaris racer Terry Hansen won the Non-Pro Masters class and the Vintage title.

The next race on the RMSHA schedule is the White Pine Hillclimb in Pinedale, WY, March 30-31.
